

Senior Parking Information:

- No students will be permitted to park on campus without a valid Senior Parking Permit. In order to obtain
 your Senior Parking Permit, you must have at the time of application, A VALID CLASS D NY STATE
 DRIVERS LICENSE, PROOF OF INSURANCE, A PROPERLY INSPECTED VEHICLE AND VALID
 REGISTRATION.
- Seniors can get a Parking Permit during the school year at the Security Office.
- The Senior Parking Permit Application is available on the High School website. THIS APPLICATION
 WILL REQUIRE A PARENTAL SIGNATURE PRIOR TO OBTAINING THE PERMIT.
- Any student who is seen driving erratically, either on school grounds or in the neighboring streets will
 have their permit taken away. In addition, any student who violated the Code of Conduct may be
 ineligible to obtain a parking permit.


